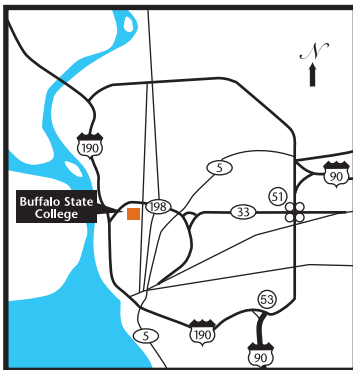
Driving to Buffalo State:

Course/Presentation

Speech-language pathologists (SLPs) play a significant role in the evaluation and treatment of swallowing in adults. An evidence-based framework will be presented to facilitate management decision making for complex patients including those with dementia. This session will include discussions of diagnostic procedures, interpreting x-rays, and implementation of current management techniques.

Learner Outcomes

At the conclusion of this session, participants will be able to:

- Define evidence-based practice and methods for implementing it in their own patient care.
- Understand the rationale for treatment of swallowing disorders versus treating the swallow.
- Plan therapy from radiographic studies.
