

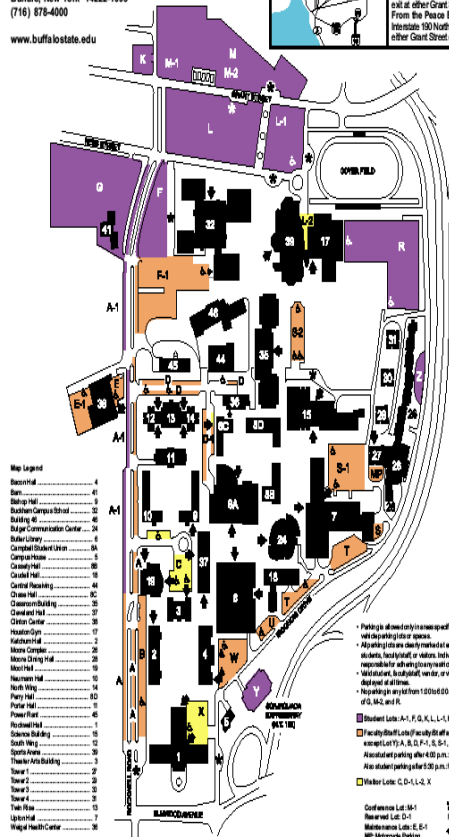
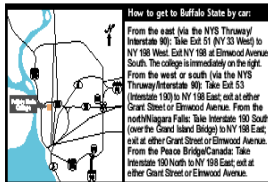
General Information
