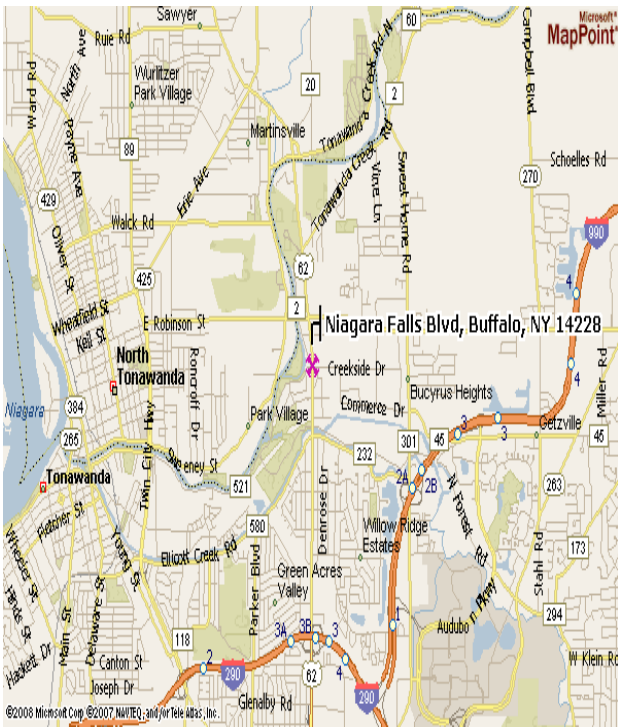


General Information

Christine M. Scott, PhD, CCC-SLP, is an assistant professor at Buffalo State College whose research interests include literacy and student learning. As a 'traveler' for many years prior to her position at BSC, Dr Scott's clinical experience included five years serving clients in skilled nursing facilities and hospitals, plus ten years serving students from Pre-K through High School in various school districts throughout the country. She received her PhD in 2007 from Wichita State University, KS. Dr. Scott has published and presented on children and adults with atypical spelling.
