

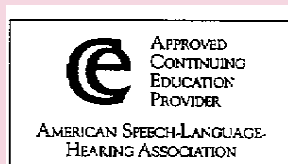

She is certified in the Lee Silverman Voice Treatment program (LSVT) and specializes in the use of alternative communication devices and assistive speech aids.

**Karen L. Bunce, MS, CCC-SLP.** As a Speech-Language Pathologist, her clinical practice focuses on treatment of voice disorders and neuro rehabilitation at Kaleida Health's outpatient clinic. Specific interests in voice diagnosis and treatment include spasmodic dysphonia, vocal fold dysfunction, chronic cough and hyper/hypofunctional voice. Clinical focus in the neurogenic population includes aphasia, dysarthria, post- concussion syndrome and other cognitive deficits.
